Section 4: INFORMATION and INSTRUCTIONS

Please read this before completing: "Section 3: WEDDING MUSIC – CANTOR – INSTRUMENTALISTS"

Some things to keep in mind:

- Any instruments that you hire will be used to enhance that song. However, all of the songs can be played on organ or piano alone, and do not require additional instruments. (Below you will find more details about instruments.)
- Please select one song under each heading by checking the box for that song.

Processional and Recessional Music:

- The Processional may be a gentler, easy-to-walk-to piece of music. It calms everyone down as the wedding party enters. The first 2 Processional pieces listed (items #6 and #7) are just this type. Music can begin gently on the organ/piano, and then would start to add a bigger, fuller sound as the bride and groom enter. This fuller sound may also be achieved by adding instruments with the organ/piano. Look at the Processional as one movement – the wedding party to the bride and groom. It flows beautifully that way. The pieces listed in this section can also be lengthened or shortened as needed in order to cover the timing of the procession, which varies according to the walking pace of the members of the wedding party, and the number of people involved.
- If you prefer a march for the Processional, a variety of options will provide that style.
- The Recessional will be joyful, upbeat, and usually played at a quicker pace to accompany the exit of the Wedding Party.
- These are only suggestions, since selecting instrumental music is a matter of personal preference. All options on the sheet will work well.

Instruments and Instrumentalists

- In addition to piano or organ accompaniment, you **may** also choose to have additional instruments to enhance the music at your wedding. Instruments are encouraged because they add a wonderful dimension to the music, but they are **optional**.
- The Director of Music is happy to contact and organize instrumentalists at your request, working within your budget. All of our instrumentalists are professionals and have years of experience playing for weddings.
- Most of the wedding music included in this worksheet has parts for these instruments.
- In addition to playing the songs listed, instruments also play for other liturgical parts of the Ceremony or Mass.
- These highly qualified instrumentalists are hired for you by the Music Director at extra cost, which currently is in the area of \$200.00 to \$250.00 per instrument. This is the standard rate charged by instrumentalists in the Chicago area. (Harpists are generally more expensive due to transportation of their instrument (usually around \$450.)
- If you have a family member or friend who is an experienced musician, they are welcome to play at the wedding. (If not, it is preferred that musicians who normally play weddings at Divine Mercy are hired.) Please provide the following information about your musician:
